



2019 Summer Party Regatta for the Harbor Heritage Perpetual Trophy **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

September 14, 2019 at the Lido Isle Yacht Club
Organizing Authority: Fleet 1 of the Harbor 20 Class Association

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2. RRS 44.1 and 44.2 will be changed so that only a One-Turn Penalty (one tack and one gybe) is required.
- 1.3. US Sailing prescriptions 60, 63.2 and 63.4 will be deleted.
- 1.4. The races are not designated Fleet Races by Harbor 20 Fleet 1.
- 1.5. Harbor 20 Fleet 1 Bylaw I.G. regarding Fleet Race Divisions will apply; however, the Race Committee may assign a skipper to a Division for this regatta.

2. CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to these sailing instructions will be announced by the Race Committee at the Competitors Meeting and may be made verbally by the Race Committee at any time.

4. RACING AREA

Racing will take place in Newport Harbor.

5. RACES

- 5.1. The attached Course Chart shows the approximate locations of possible marks to be utilized for the courses to be sailed.
- 5.2. There may be separate starts for each Division. The number of Divisions will be determined based on the number of entries. Division assignments will be announced at the Competitors Meeting.
- 5.3. The course to be sailed will be announced at the Competitors Meeting.
- 5.4. The course may be different for each Division.
- 5.5. After the starting signal, the RC may change the course or abandon the race with verbal signals. This changes RRS 32 and 33.

6. THE START/FINISH

- 6.1. All races will be started using RRS Appendix S.
- 6.2. The start line will be between the course side of a staff displaying an orange flag on the signal boat and the course side of a nearby start mark approximately to port.
- 6.3. The finish line will be between the course side of an orange staff on a signal boat and the course side of a nearby finish mark.

7. TIME LIMIT

The Race Committee will determine if a time limit is needed. Boats still racing after a time limit has been imposed will be informed verbally of the time limit and, if not finished at the time limit, will be scored based on her position at the time the race was ended.

8. PROTESTS

The Race Committee must be informed of a protest by the protesting boat prior to her finish. Hearings will be informal and heard as soon as possible after the race by a Protest Committee selected by the Race Committee. The hearing format will be determined by the Race Committee. This changes RRS 63.

9. SCORING

The Low Point Scoring System in RRS Appendix A will apply, except that no scores will be excluded.

10. TROPHIES

10.1. Prizes will be awarded.

10.2. The Harbor Heritage Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the boat determined by the Race Committee to be the winner.
